## WELCOME BY HOST CHURCH / RESOLUTION OF THANKS

noted that the church's Food Pantry will open at noon, having decided to remain open during the presbytery meeting.

The Moderator appointed [name] to draft a Resolution of Thanks to the host congregation for presentation at the end of the meeting.

# **WORSHIP**

The presbytery shared a service of worship, led by the Rev. Russ Roth. During the service, the sermon focused on Genesis 11:1-9 (the story of the Tower of Babel). The Rev. Ross noted that the real issue of the story (related to God's commandment at the end of the Noah account to "multiply and spread through the earth" is the people's resistance to the commandment to spread out through the earth. In fact, the text makes it clear that the motivation for building the tower is precisely to *avoid* being spread out. He related this commandment and resistance to the story of Pentecost in Acts 2. Rather than correcting the confusion of tongues in the Babel story, Pentecost is about the empowerment of the Holy Spirit so that the people of God will be sent as witnesses.

Following worship, the presbytery moved outside, where the rest of the meeting was conducted in a tent behind the church building.

#### Background / Rationale

The Council welcomed the Rev. Jamie Tyrell, HR who is currently a member of the Budget & Finance Committee and formerly served as Stated Supply of the Atlanta Presbyterian Church. Jamie spoke of Dick Matthews, a mission worker of the Independent Baptist Church, who inspired Jamie and his wife to teach at mission schools in Cambodia. The community in which Jamie has volunteered has developed a "no-sweat" manufacturing business, in order to become more self-sufficient. The Council viewed samples of the T-shirts which are produced. Jamie asked permission to show a 9 ½-minute video during the upcoming presbytery meeting; and to have a table to provide information and the opportunity to purchase shirts at \$8.00 apiece. Dick Matthews is a micro-financer, who has facilitated loans for the business; all they need are sales. Custom colors can be provided for orders of fifty or more. Fourteen people are trained, but they do not have the orders to employ all fourteen. The sizes of the T-shirts run from Extra Small to XXLarge.

The Council encouraged Jamie to help the organization pursue legitimate certification of the business as "Fair Trade," to enhance their marketing in the United States.

### (Transitional Leader Search Team)

6. **Approved** a request of the Transitional Leader Search Team for time on the docket of the May presbytery meeting. The Ministry Team will report to the presbytery maximum full-time total salary for a Transitional Leader of \$105,000. This will assist in seeking and calling the person whom God has in mind for leadership of the presbytery in this particular time.

The Search Team will prepare the required figures for the minimum and maximum effective salaries, based on the full-time total salary.

#### (Polity & Review Committee)

7. **Received** a report from the Polity and Review Committee that the five gatherings for stated clerks and pastors were held as scheduled, with the following results:

Five events were held (Lyons, Hornell, Bath, Geneva, Lodi).

- 32 churches were represented
- 49 persons were present, including 12 pastors.

The response to the gatherings was very positive, and the new *Handbook for Clerks of Session* was well-received.

The gathering at Hornell was followed by the first meeting of that area's cluster, who began making plans for the rest of the year.

Many clerks expressed concern that it is difficult to find contact information for clerks. Several noticed that clerks of session are not listed in the directory of congregations, only pastors. At three of the sessions, emails were gathered. Perhaps the list can be more fully completed, with a directory accessible on the website.

### (Rural & Migrant Ministries)

8. **Endorse** an upcoming annual Women's Conference, hosted by Rural and Migrant Ministries, to be held in Binghamton, NY; and **authorized** Moderator Dick Schied to send a letter confirming the action. The endorsement will help Rural Migrant Ministries to obtain a Synod grant for the Women's Conference). The focus of the conference is empowering women.

#### (West Virginia Mission Work Trip)

9. Endorse the September 2016 West Virginia Work Trip.

#### (Budget & Finance)

10. **Place** last year's budget item for debt reduction (\$52,000) in a special interest-bearing account. This would be a good faith response to the goal of eliminating the presbytery's own debt to the funds (@ \$200,000).

# **CAMP WHITMAN**

Lea Kone, Director of Camp Whitman on Seneca Lake, and Tom Bailey, Board member, presented the report. Tom Bailey celebrated that for the first time in over five years, Camp Whitman has a functioning Board of Directors. Tom Bailey is Chair of the Board; Marsha Wenhold (Genesee Valley) is Vice-Chair; and Michelle Sumption (Genesee Valley) is Secretary.

The Board hosted Brian Frick, from the Office of the General Assembly, to help the board to understand various models for organizing camp programs. There are 122 camps in the PCUSA: one third are independent; two thirds are owned by a council or mid-council. Tom shared a presentation by Brian Frick that encouraged the Camp Whitman Board to begin with the question, "**Why** do we have a camp/conference ministry within the two presbyteries?" and only then move to the "How" and "What" questions. The presbyteries will be invited to participate in the question of "Why?"

Ton Bailey challenged the members and the presbytery to consider a challenge of donating \$500 donation to place a steel roof on one of the ten cabins which need roof repairs. Of the 20 smaller cabins, 10 are in serious need of roof replacement.

Lea Kone noted that while she is clear as to what her "Why?" is, personally, the nature of camping has changed in the 63 years the camp has been in existence. "It is really hard to lead an organization which does not have a clear statement of what its mission and purpose is." She asked, "Can we put the same intention into the mission of the camp, and its leadership, as we put into examining pastors for congregations?"

#### "WE HAVE ALL OF OUR LEADERSHIP FOR THE SUMMERTIME!!!!!"

Pine Camp is 100% full. We are on par with last year's registration for the Traditional Camp, but have only 63 registered at this point.

Weston Presbyterian Church gave a \$3000 donation to the scholarship fund.

Nancy Farrell has volunteered to be Chaplain for Week One.

### **RECONVENING**

Moderator Dick Shied assumed leadership of the meeting, and offered prayer.

# REPORT OF TRANSITIONAL LEADER SEARCH COMMITTEE

Elder Rosanna Bates and the Rev. David Ashby presented the report of the Search Committee for a Transitional Leader, and distributed copies of the revised Ministry Information Form for the Transitional Presbytery Leader. They guided the presbytery through the Ministry Information Form, describing the process by which they came to the results shown in the Form.

Opportunity was given for questions and comments from presbyters.

Conversation turned to the financial implications of the search. *Do the presbytery's resources allow for a full-time call.* A suggestion was made that the Search Committee explore possibilities for grants through organizations researching change experiences in organizations (e.g. Lilly Foundation).

Upon motion, the presbytery VOTED to:

1. **Approve** the Ministry Information Form with the change of the Effective Salary to \$30,000 - \$50,000; and **authorize** the Transitional Leader Search Committee to distribute the Ministry Information Form through Church Leadership Connection, and engage in appropriate advertising of the position.

2. **Refer** to a joint committee, composed of members of the Transitional Leader Search Committee and the Budget & Finance Committee, along with the Temporary Transitional Leader (with voice and not vote) and others whom the Moderator may appoint, to analyze the ability of the presbytery to finance a full-time leader for two years; and report back to the presbytery no later than the September 27, 2016 presbytery meeting.

### **BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE**

The Rev. Tim Johnson HR, chair, presented the report of the Budget & Finance Committee.

- The Committee voted to create a separate account, seeded with the \$53,000 budgeted surplus from 2015, toward paying the presbytery's debt to itself.
- The Committee is working on the issue of the Dedicated Accounts, and how they are spent. The
  Committee is trying to bring to a close the practice of "spending other people's money" in order to
  support the work of the presbytery.

## **DESIGN TEAM REPORT**

David Kilgore reported for the Design Team, which is working on three projects:

- Cluster Arrangements (11 clusters)
  - Several clusters have been working already
  - o Some clusters are in process
  - A few clusters have not yet reported.
- A means of sharing resources. This is more complicated than the cluster process, and would involve networking of shareable resources (both to give and to receive). The presbytery website may be an important medium to implement such a network.
- Communication throughout the presbytery. How does communication happen in this presbytery, and what are possibilities, moving forward?

The Committee on Ministry is working on investing in our smaller churches. Two of our churches–Romulus and Prattsburgh—have needs related to their buildings. David provided a flyer for a "Weekend Workday" (the weekend of July 29, 2016 at Prattsburg). The Romulus church invited the presbytery to appoint an Administrative Commission to "come alongside" the church session as the congregation discerns its future.

#### PRESBYTERY WOMEN

Linda Werts presented the report of the Presbytery Women of the Presbytery of Geneva. The Spring Gathering on April 30 at Elmira First was an excellent event. Worship was led by the Rev. Katherine Griffis. More than fifty women attended, representing twelve congregations. The program was "Building Minds in South Sudan," presented by Sabastian Dits, one of the Lost Boys from South Sudan.

The opportunity has arisen for women from Geneva Presbytery to participate in a mission group to Cuba, working with the Reformed Church of Cuba.

The Church-wide women ministry has begun a poster campaign, and has initiated a "lantern campaign." Park Church, Newark has participated in a lantern campaign for girls attending a new girls school in South Sudan.

The Fall Gathering will be Friday September 16, 2016 in Geneva.

# SYNOD MEDIATION TEAM

Katherine Griffis reported on a Synod-sponsored mediation training event offered by Lombard Mennonite Peace Center in Lombard, Illinois. Katherine and Leah Ntuala attended the event. Katherine shared a basic overview of the event.

# **DISMISSAL OF FAIRVILLE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMISSION**

The presbytery VOTED to dissolve the Fairville Administrative Commission, with the authority to resolve any remaining details related to the sale of the Fairville Church property.

## Sale of Hedgesville Presbyterian Church Property

That the Administrative Commission appointed by the Presbytery of Geneva on November 17, 2014, in accordance with the Resolution adopted by the presbytery on May 19, 2015, dissolving the Hedgesville Church, and with the concurrence of the Presbytery Board of Trustees [General Council] recommends that the Presbytery of Geneva, Inc. (the "Presbytery"):

- 1. Convey the property heretofore known as **Hedgesville Presbyterian Church**, located at 2757 County Route 102, in the Town of Woodhull, County of Steuben and State of New York (Tax Acct. No. 309.00-01-015.000), as acquired by said church by Deed recorded in the Steuben County Clerk's Office in Liber 92 of Deeds, page 220, to the Boyd's Corners Bible Church by Quit Claim Deed pursuant to the Purchase and Sale Contract last dated March 24, 2016, and approved by the Administrative Commission, providing for a sale price of One Dollar (\$1.00), subject to:
  - a. Vesting of title to the property in presbytery, by reason of dissolution of the church, as confirmed by the Supreme Court of the State of New York:
  - b. Approval of the terms and conditions of the conveyance by the Supreme Court of the State of New York; and
- 2. Authorize payment of all necessary and customary closing costs, including attorney's fees and the expenses of procuring the Court Order [both as to (i) dissolution of the Church and vesting of title to the Property in the Presbytery, and (ii) conveyance of the Property as authorized herein] from the \_\_\_\_\_ Fund of presbytery; and
- 3. Authorize the Moderator of the Administrative Commission,t he Chairperson of the Presbytery Board of Trustees [General Council] and the Stated Clerk of Presbytery and/or the Presbytery Attorney to execute and deliver such documents, and other such acs5tions as may be required to effectuate the foregoing.
