It was **moved and carried** to approve the docket. It was **moved and carried** to approve items 1.01, 1.02, 1.03, and 1.04 from the consent agenda.

The Rev. Dr. Joelle S. Davis, the Stated Clerk, presented the following report:

*1.01 The Clerk **moved** that the minutes of the March 9, 2013 Stated Meeting be received. (The minutes are posted online with the meeting materials.)

***1.02** The Clerk **moved** that the minutes of the June 29, 2013 Special Meeting be received, with one correction. (The minutes are posted online and available in your church mailbox.)

***1.03** The Clerk **moved** that the presbytery concur with the recommendation of the General Council to approve the request of the First Presbyterian Church of Cohocton to sell 25 feet of land from the manse property for \$3000 plus legal and survey fees.

***1.04** The Clerk **moved** that the presbytery concur with the recommendation of the General Council to approve the request of the Burdett Presbyterian Church to replace their sanctuary roof. The cost is being covered by specific donations and reserve funds.

1.05 The Clerk **reported** that all communications have been forwarded to the appropriate committees. **Rev. Davis reminded teaching elders and ruling elders commissioned to particular service that the Boundaries Awareness Workshop on October 15th, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., at the First Presbyterian Church of Penn Yan is a mandatory event.**

The Rev. J. Christy Wareham welcomed the presbytery to the Park Presbyterian Church. It was **moved and carried** to thank the Park Presbyterian Church, the Rev. Christy Wareham, its members, its staff, and friends, for their hospitality and for the luncheon that they will provide.

The Presbytery of Geneva welcomed the Rev. Allison Seed, Regional Representative of the Board of Pensions, who updated the presbytery about news from the Board of Pensions. The prescription drug provider will be switched from Express Scripts to Catamaran for 2014. An improvement in service is expected. A new service called, "A Call to Health," will be in place between October 2013 and November 2014. Participants will be able to reduce their deductibles from 1.5% to 1%. Information about the Affordable Care Act is available and must be sent by churches to all employees by October 1, 2013. The invitations for the CREDO conferences have been sent out. If you, or your pastor, received an invitation, please encourage attendance. The dues for the medical portion of the plan will rise to 23% in 2014. In 2015, the dues will be 23% for member only coverage and 24.5% for member and family coverage. The additional 1.5% can be shared, in whole or in part, with the employee. The Board is available to help set up 125 plans with churches. Please contact <u>ASeed@pensions.org</u> with additional questions.

The Presbytery of Geneva welcomed the Rev. Dr. Barry Dawson and Shelly Dawson, Regional Liaisons for Southeast Asia, based in Bangkok, Thailand. The Dawsons have responsibilities for mission relationships and mission co-workers in nine countries in the Southeast Asia region. The Dawsons' ministry has included numerous churches in the United States and internationally. They will work with global mission partners in all nine of the countries in the Southeast Asian region. They will also provide pastoral oversight for all of the mission co-workers in the area. Please prayerfully consider financially supporting this ministry, or supporting this ministry in other ways, including through prayer.

The Rev. J. Christy Wareham led our worship service. The scripture focus for the day was Psalm 51. Rev. Wareham reminded the gathered body of the opportunities that await us when we truly welcome Christ into our hearts. The Prayer of Patrick of Ireland is a reminder of these possibilities. The Lord's Supper was shared.

Interim Camp Director, Rhonda Everdyke, and Intern, Ileya Heins, presented information about the 2013 summer camping season to the presbytery. The goal for our 2013 season was to reach 303 campers. The actual number of campers in 2013 was 362, a 20% increase over 2012. The new programs, which included Day Camp, the Volunteer Chaplain Program, and our partnership with the DRIVE program, were all big successes.

The Rev. Dr. Joelle Davis recognized the ordination anniversaries within the presbytery, as well as church anniversaries for 2013.

The Rev. Gail Heimberger, co-Chair of the Committee on Ministry, invited the Presbytery to celebrate the ministries of these colleagues in ministry who have taken new positions:

- The Rev. James Henery from First Presbyterian Church of Ithaca to the Presbytery of Transylvania
- The Rev. Gary Chorpenning from North Presbyterian Church of Elmira to the Presbytery of Washington (Pennsylvania)
- The Rev. Blake Severson from First Presbyterian Church of Lyons to the Presbytery of Blackhawk

The committee also invited the Presbytery to welcome the following colleagues in ministry:

- The Rev. Nancy Meehan Yao as Stated Supply Pastor for First Presbyterian Church of Hammondsport
- The Rev. Bryan Bond as Stated Supply Pastor for the First Presbyterian Church of Pulteney
- The Rev. Deborah Grohman as Pastor at the First Presbyterian Church of Ontario Center
- The Rev. Walter Stuber as Stated Supply Pastor for the First Presbyterian Church of Wolcott
- The Rev. Harold Delhagen, Transitional Leader of the Synod of the Northeast, who has transferred his membership from the Reformed Church in America to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

The committee reported the following actions that were taken on behalf of the presbytery since its last stated meeting:

- 1. Approved the formation of the Pastor Nominating Committee for the First Presbyterian Church of Bath.
- 2. Approved the use of money to pay for coaching at the Wolcott church.
- 3. Approved the contract between the Session of the Presbyterian Church of Red Creek and Lucille Richmond as a Lay Pastor (hereafter referred to as "CLP"). The agreement shall be for the period of 1/1/2013 to 12/31/2013. The CLP is employed at the rate of \$95.00 per weekly service.

- 4. Approved Frank Williams for the pulpit supply list.
- 5. Approved the Rev. Harold Delhagen as a member of the presbytery and his transfer from the Reformed Church in America to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).
- 6. Approved the Church Information Form for the Geneva congregation.
- 7. Approved the contract between the Session of the Presbyterian Church of Hammondsport and the Rev. Nancy Meehan Yao as Stated Supply Pastor. The agreement shall be for the period of 6/1/2013 to 5/31/2014. The pastor is employed on a ½ time basis and compensated as follows: Cash salary of \$20,607.00, housing allowance of \$2,500.00, pension and medical benefits of \$11,265.00, travel expenses at the IRS rate, vacation for one month (4 Sundays), and study leave of \$500.00 and two weeks per year (2 Sundays).
- 8. Approved the motion to include the "Certified Lay Preachers" on the Pulpit Supply List as "Approved Supply Persons."
- 9. Approved Ruling Elder Betsey Tyrrell (Atlanta) for the Pulpit Supply List.
- 10. Authorized Ruling Elder Robert Sell and Ruling Elder Paul Yoder to administer the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at the First Presbyterian Church of Horseheads while the Rev. Jonathan Knight is on sabbatical.
- 11. Approved the Rev. Jim Hicks and the Rev. Joanne Bartel to serve as temporary supply pastors for the First Presbyterian Church of Ithaca.
- 12. Approved the Rev. Jim Hicks to serve in the bounds of our presbytery for this position.
- 13. Approved the request of the First Presbyterian Church of Lyons to dissolve the call with the Rev. Blake Severson and approved the transfer of the Rev. Blake Severson to the Presbytery of Blackhawk.
- 14. Approved the request of the North Presbyterian Church of Elmira to dissolve the call with the Rev. Gary Chorpenning and approved the transfer of the Rev. Gary Chorpenning to the Presbytery of Washington.
- 15. Approved the contract between the Rev. Bryan Bond and the Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Pulteney as a Stated Supply Pastor. The agreement shall be for the period of 8/1/2013 to 12/31/2013. The pastor is employed on a ½ time basis and compensated as follows: Cash salary and housing allowance of \$17,116.00, housing allowance of \$5,991.00, Board of Pension coverage, travel expenses at the IRS rate, vacation for one month (4 Sundays), and study leave of \$500.00 and two weeks per year (2 Sundays).
- 16. Approved the contract between the Rev. Russell Duncan and the Session of Christ the King Fellowship (Spencer) as a Stated Supply Pastor. The agreement shall be for the period of 9/1/2013 to 8/31/2013. The pastor is employed on a ½ time basis and compensated as follows: Cash salary and housing allowance of \$16,864.00, housing allowance of \$12,000.00, Board of Pension coverage, travel expenses at the IRS rate, vacation for one month (4 Sundays), and study leave of \$500.00 and two weeks per year (2 Sundays).
- 17. Approved the call of the Rev. Deborah Grohman as Pastor of the Ontario Center Presbyterian Church beginning on September 4, 2013. The terms of call are as follows: Cash salary of \$11,213.00, housing allowance of \$29,000.00, deferred congregation of \$6000.00, SECA of 7.65% of effective salary, full Board of

Pensions benefits, business/professional expenses of \$1000.00, travel expenses at the IRS rate, vacation for one month (4 Sundays), and study leave of two weeks per year (2 Sundays) and \$1000.00.

- 18. Approved the transfer of the Rev. Deborah Grohman from the Presbytery of Genesee Valley to our presbytery.
- 19. Approved the contract between the Wolcott Presbyterian Church and the Rev. Walter Stuber as a Stated Supply Pastor. The agreement shall be for the period of 9/4/2013 to 9/3/2014. The pastor is employed on a ½ time basis and compensated as follows: Cash salary of \$5,991.00, housing allowance of \$17,116.00, Board of Pensions coverage, travel expenses at the IRS rate, vacation for one month (4 Sundays), and study leave of \$500.00 and two weeks per year (2 Sundays).
- 20. Approved the Rev. Walter Stuber, a member of the Presbytery of Genesee Valley, to labor within the bounds of the Presbytery of Geneva to serve the First Presbyterian Church of Wolcott.

The committee shared with the presbytery the recommended Minimum Compensation Guidelines for 2014 as found in **Addendum A**.

Rhonda Everdyke, Communications Director, provided information about upcoming events. The presbytery is invited to pray for the thirty-two people who will attend the Third Annual Mission and Learning Experience to New York City. Individuals can sign up as prayer partners for those who are taking this trip, as well. A video by the Rev. Jamie Tyrrell, H.R., introduced his book, *Prayers for Busy People*. Rev. Tyrrell will do a workshop on this resource at the Presbytery Office on Thursday, September 19, 2013, at 11:00 a.m. A box lunch will be provided. All are welcome.

Ruling Elder Virginia Champlin provided information about upcoming events for Presbyterian Women and the Thank Offering. A new Horizons bible study is available. (Thank you to the churches of Hector and Lodi, and the Rev. Nancy Meehan Yao, for being a test site for this curriculum!) The Fall Gathering will be at the Seneca Falls Presbyterian Church on September 28th. The Thank Offering is used for multiple mission efforts of the Presbyterian Women. Individuals and congregations are invited to participate in these second mile giving efforts.

Ruling Elder Graham Wightman (Corning) reported on the study documents available for congregations on the definition of marriage, prepared by the denominational offices. Communications Director, Rhonda Everdyke, invited the presbytery to two regional gatherings which will be held to explore these materials. The first series will be held Wednesday, October 30th, Wednesday, November 6th, and Wednesday, November 13th, 2013, from 11:30 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at the Lyons Presbyterian Church. The second series will be held Wednesday, February 4th, and Wednesday, February 12th, 2014, from 11:30 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at a church in the southern portion of the presbytery. Everyone is welcome. Bring a brown bag lunch.

The Presbytery welcomed the Rev. Harold Delhagen, Transitional Leader for the Synod of the Northeast, to share his reflections on the state of the Synod and its work groups. Rev. Delhagen shared some of his ministry history with the presbytery. The Synod has about 200,000 members in 1100 congregations and twenty-two presbyteries. The Synod relates to eight councils of churches. The Synod transitional group has identified three

major assets that they hope to cultivate: racial/ethnic diversity, emerging leadership, and financial resources. "A New Way Forward" will be available on the Synod website by the end of the week. See <u>www.synodne.org</u>.

The Rev. David Ashby, Chair, shared an update with the presbytery about the Mercy Place New Church Development as the written report found as **Addendum B**.

The Rev. Glenn Kennedy, Chair, shared an update with the presbytery about the Corning Chinese Christian Church New Church Development. The Administrative Commission was formed in December 2007 and expects that the church will incorporate in 2014!

Ruling Elder Dick Schied, Chair, shared an update with the presbytery about the work of the Park Presbyterian Church Administrative Commission. The focus of the work of the commission is on restoring the harmony and unity of the church.

Ruling Elder Barbara Scudder, Chair, shared updates with the presbytery on the work of the General Council. Members of the presbytery are invited to share their written comments on the number of meetings of the Presbytery of Geneva with the Council by sending them to Barbara (<u>hscudder@stny.rr.com</u>) or the office (<u>kjensen@presbyteryofgeneva.org</u>) prior to the November meeting of General Council. Please share these comments by October 25, 2013.

The Council reported on the Mission Grants awarded for 2013 as found in Addendum C.

The Rev. Jim Yao, Chair, shared the report of the Committee on Budget and Finance. The Committee on Budget and Finance moved the adoption of the 2013 budget as presented in **Addendum D.** It was moved and carried to table the vote on the budget until following the report of the Subcommittee on Personnel.

The Rev. Jim Kerr, Co-Chair of the Subcommittee on Personnel, addressed the presbytery. The committee is going to review the two combined positions of Executive Presbyter/Stated Clerk and Communications Director/Interim Camp Director. Comments about these can be addressed to <u>reviwk@yahoo.com</u> or other members of the committee. Recommendations will then be brought to the General Council.

It was noted for the presbytery that the investment loss item on page four of the budget should not be there and should be zeroed out.

It was moved and carried to extend the docket by another fifteen minutes.

A motion to lay on the table the vote on the budget until a special meeting can be called by Council failed.

The motion to approve the budget was approved.

The Rev. Leah Ntuala, Chair, shared the report of the Committee on Nominations. The committee moved the names of individuals to serve on the various committees of the presbytery as found in **Addendum E**. It was moved and carried to close the nominations and cast a unanimous ballot.

The General Council invited the presbytery to participate in the Service of Installation for the Vice Moderator, the Rev. David Kilgore, as found in **Addendum G.**

The General Council moved the names of individuals to serve on the Committee on Nominations as found in **Addendum F.** The motion was approved.

The Council reported the following actions taken on behalf of the presbytery since its last Stated Meeting:

- Approved the Restoration of Stained Glass Windows project of the First Presbyterian Church of Big Flats. The Session approved the expenditure of \$47,737.00, which includes the installation of a permanent protective storm system, on April 7, 2013. The money will come from their Reserve Fund and member contributions. The work is to be completed by Cathedral Crafts, Inc.
- 2. Approved the request of The First Presbyterian Church of Waterloo to embark on a capital campaign to raise \$75,000 by 2017 (Phase one) with the final goal of \$500,000 over the next 10 years. The projects to be included are: Exterior Painting, Roofing repairs (water penetration around flashing), Masonry and repointing brick, Stained Glass window preservation, Electrical - Sanctuary and kitchen, Boiler Room Fire Proofing, Handicap Accessibility, Bee Removal, Repair and Seal Towers, Interior painting - balcony area in Sanctuary, Boiler replacement
- 3. Approved the signing of the Affidavit and Certificate of Incumbency and Guaranty of the Presbytery Investment and Loan Program to the First Presbyterian Church of Ontario Center, in the amount of \$20,000.00.
- 4. Approved the appointment of Rhonda Everdyke as the Interim Camp Director.
- 5. Approved the fund request of Christ the King Fellowship (Spencer) for \$1000 from the Mission Priorities of the Presbytery line items. The Spencer congregation will match this amount.

It was moved and carried to extend the docket by an additional fifteen minutes.

The Rev. Nancy Meehan Yao, Chair, shared the report of the Committee on Preparation for Ministry. The committee moved that Ruling Elder Cathy Foerster (Ithaca) be approved to seek a position as a Ruling Elder Commissioned to Particular Pastoral Service. The motion was approved. (Please see Cathy's CV as found in **Addendum H.)**

The committee moved to recommend to the Presbytery that Dr. Cynthia Weaver (Ithaca) be enrolled as a Candidate. After a period of examination, the motion was approved. (Please refer to Cynthia's Statement of Call as found in **Addendum I.**)

The committee invited the presbytery to participate in the service to Receive a Candidate Under Care as found in **Addendum J.**

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by the Vice Moderator pro tempore, the Rev. David Kilgore, at 1:00 p.m.

Addendum B Presbytery of Geneva September 17, 2013

Report of the Mercy Place Administrative Commission 09-17-13

Linda Kataskas (RE), Cheryl Peeples (TE), Bryan Bond (TE), Tom Bailey (RE), Bob Bell (RE), David Ashby (TE, convener)

The Administrative Commission continues to oversee Mercy Place as a New Faith Community/NCD, to develop specific strategies for the project, and to review and discover funding options.

Bryan Bond continues to function as the Organizing Evangelist of Mercy Place, meeting with individuals and leading small fellowship and semi-worshiping community events in the VanEtten and Ithaca area. Given the nature of the persons we are approaching, Bryan is keeping the group events informal and low-keyed. Whether participants will be interested in moving toward a more recognizable "worshiping community" as the PC(U.S.A.) envisions them remains to be seen, but Bryan and the AC are committed to nurture Mercy Place for at least another year to give the vision of community enough time to develop.

Overtures to First Presbyterian Church in Ithaca to become a partner in Mercy Place have been delayed by their search for a new pastor.

The AC continues to work on how Mercy Place may fit into the "evolving" General Assembly funding patterns, and is watching very carefully the Synod of the Northeast funding patterns which will be emerging shortly with the Synod Assembly in October 2013. The potentially greater flexibility in Synod and GA funding could be very helpful for this mission which does not fit in traditional categories. In the meantime, the AC is working on our 1001 Worshiping Community application (which is fairly structured, but far less than the New Church Development application) and on the less structured Seed Grant of up to \$7,500. Both will need the endorsement of Presbytery Council for submission.

We anticipate the 2014 Mercy Place expense budget to be the same as 2013, but the income side is, as mentioned above, still a work in progress.

In the meantime, we ask for your support, ideas, and prayers as we nurture a place for souls uncomfortable in traditional congregational settings.

Addendum I Presbytery of Geneva September 17, 2013

> Cynthia A. Weaver Statement of Call

The realization that I have a call to ministry came very slowly over time. I was born and raised in the Presbyterian Church (United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and now PC(USA)), and I always took the church and its teachings seriously, though I never considered that the seriousness I felt might be an aspect of call. Several years ago our associate pastor at the time noticed my interest in learning more about the Bible than was afforded in our church's Bible study classes. She suggested I take a class at Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School (CRCDS), and while I was hesitant, I knew I wanted to know more, and it was this desire to know more which led me to take another class and then another and eventually to matriculate.

While I knew I loved learning about the Bible and church history and theology, it was others who noted the passion I expressed when talking about my classes and who first mentioned the word "call". I was reluctant to acknowledge the growing excitement I felt as I took more and more classes and began to consider being in the pulpit and preaching. After all, I had a profession I enjoyed and had no practical reason to consider ministry, but the pull to pursue ordination grew stronger. Even though I was expressing my hesitance to others, I was at the same time carefully meeting the requirements to receive a Master of Divinity degree from CRCDS and beginning the discernment process by becoming an Inquirer with the Susquehanna Valley Presbytery.

God has always been very gentle with me, never getting my attention in loud or frightening ways. Instead, God taps me on the shoulder and whispers, "Psst, look over here." What I have found in this process of discernment, when I have dared to look, is one open door after another, and God has been patient with me while I stood at the threshold of each for quite a while before daring to step through. Each time I do my excitement grows, and I find welcome and encouragement and more open doors in the path ahead.

During the 2012-13 school year my placement for Supervised Ministry was at First Presbyterian Church in Elmira. There I was given the opportunity to preach and teach and minister to the congregation, and I found myself feeling the joy of being more fully who God made me to be than I have ever felt in my current work as a psychologist or in any other endeavor. As a result, and only with the help and persistence of the Holy Spirit, I believe I have a call to ordered ministry in the Presbyterian Church (USA) as a teaching elder.
