Justice and Peace Keynote #1

The Presbytery of Geneva welcomes **the Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson**, Director of the PC(USA)'s Public Policy Witness Office in Washington, D.C., to share with us information about the work of our office, especially in the area of justice and peace.

1.00 The Report of the Stated Clerk

- *1.01 The Clerk moves that the minutes of the March 20, 2012 Annual Meeting and the May 3, 2012 Special Meeting be received. (The minutes are posted online with the meeting materials.)
- *1.02 The Clerk **reports** that the Administrative Commission to install the Rev. Glenn Kennedy as pastor of the United Church of Painted Post on May 20, 2012, has completed its work. The Clerk **moves** that the Administrative Commission be dismissed with the Presbytery's thanks.
- *1.03 The Clerk moves that the General Council and the Committee on Ministry be given authority to take routine actions on behalf of the Presbytery of Geneva following today's meeting and until the Presbytery reconvenes on September 25, 2012, and that all actions taken shall be reported to the Presbytery at that meeting.
- **1.04** The Clerk **reports** that all communications have been forwarded to the appropriate committees.
- **1.05** The Clerk **reports** that the 2012 schedule for Presbytery meetings is as follows:

Tuesday, September 25, 2012 at 9:30 a.m. - Sodus

Saturday, November 17, 2012 at 9:30 a.m. – Watkins Glen

2.00 The Report of the Committee on Ministry

- **2.01** The Committee on Ministry moves that the Presbytery approve the following items:
 - *2.01.1 To appoint the Rev. Betsey Crimmins as the Moderator of the First Presbyterian Church of Corning.
 - *2.01.2 To appoint the Rev. Leah Ntuala as the Moderator of the Presbyterian Church of Oaks Corners.
 - *2.01.3 To approve the contract between the Session of the Presbyterian Church of Burdett and Ruling Elder Richard Evans as a Commissioned Ruler Elder to Particular Pastoral Service (hereafter referred to as "CLP"). The agreement shall be for the period of 1/1/2012 to 12/31/2012. The CLP is employed on a ¼ time basis and compensated as follows: Cash salary of \$2,952.00, housing allowance of \$8,432.00, pension of \$3,658.00, travel expenses at the IRS rate, vacation for one month (4 Sundays), and study leave of \$250.00 and two weeks per year (2 Sundays).

- *2.01.4 To approve the contract between the Session of the Presbyterian Church of Prattsburgh and Ruling Elder Donald Peek as a Commissioned Ruler Elder to Particular Pastoral Service (hereafter referred to as "CLP"). The agreement shall be for the period of 4/1/2012 to 6/30/2012. The CLP is employed on a ¼ time basis and compensated as follows: Cash salary of \$1,440.00, housing allowance of \$1,446.00, pension of \$896.00, travel expenses at the IRS rate, vacation for one month (4 Sundays), and study leave of \$250.00 and two weeks per year (2 Sundays).
- 2.01.5 To approve the transfer of the Rev. Virginia Murray (H.R.) from the Presbytery of Hudson River to the Presbytery of Geneva.
- **2.02** The committee **reports** the following items for information:
 - 2.02.1 The First Presbyterian Church of Ontario Center has been given permission to form a Pastor Nominating Committee.
 - 2.02.2 A triennial visit with Western Presbyterian Church in Palmyra has been completed.
 - 2.02.3 The Rev. Russell Duncan has been approved as an addition to the Pulpit Supply List.
 - 2.02.4 The Administrative Commission working with the First Presbyterian Church of Dundee is negotiating with the Rev. Ellen Donnan, on behalf of the presbytery, to serve up to ½ time as a stated supply pastor for the congregation.
- **2.03** The committee **invites** Ruling Elder Tom Bailey (Spencer) to speak briefly with the presbytery as the Liaison to the Board of Pensions.

3.00 The Report of the Committee on Preparation for Ministry

3.01 The Committee **moves to recommend** to the Presbytery a waiver of the requirement of G-2.0607c (a candidate must produce a transcript from a theological institution showing a course of study, including Greek, with satisfactory grades in all areas of study) for Inquirer Kate Merriman (Trumansburg).

4.00 The Report of General Council

- **4.01** The General Council **places into nomination** the name of Rev. Leah Ntuala to serve in the Class of 2015 on the Subcommittee on Nominations.
- **4.02** The Council **moves** that the Presbytery approve the following people to serve as an Administrative Commission to explore the possibility of a New Church Development in the Spencer-Van Etten area, under the leadership of the Rev. Bryan Bond: Rev. David Ashby (Chair), Ruling Elder Tom Bailey (Spencer), Ruling Elder Bob Bell (Elmira, First), Ruling Elder Linda Kataskas (Shortsville), and Rev. Cheryl Peeples. Information about this new church development may be found as Appendix A.
- 4.03 The Council reports that the Session of North Presbyterian Church of Elmira has moved the following question: "Shall the North Presbyterian Church of Elmira request dismissal to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church?" In keeping with the "Guidelines Concerning Dissolving or Dismissing a Congregation of The Presbytery of Geneva," a congregational meeting will be held on May 20, 2012 to discuss this motion. A congregational vote to take action on the motion will occur in September.
- **4.04** The Council **reports** on the financial situation of the presbytery as found in Appendix B.

Justice and Peace Keynote #2

The Presbytery of Geneva welcomes former Moderator of the PC(USA), **Ruling Elder Rick Ufford-Chase**, co-director of Stony Point Center, Executive Director of the Presbyterian Peace Fellowship, and founder of BorderLinks Ministries. Elder Ufford-Chase will be addressing issues of immigration as part of our year-long study of justice and peace issues.

PROPOSAL FOR A NEW CHURCH DEVELOPMENT

Mercy Church - "Broken Lives, Broken World....Amazing Grace"

Vision/Goals:

- 1. We will be all-inclusive (ALL are welcome)
- 2. We will be missional (Intentionally outward-focused)
- 3. We will be theologically minimal (Jesus, the cross/resurrection, sacraments)
- 4. We will be communal (Doing life together, bearing burdens and sharing joys)

Believing that salvation is a freely given gift from God (it's ALL of grace, from first to last), and believing that this gift is intended for all people, Mercy Church will seek, welcome, and involve persons of every race, socio-economic status, religious background, sexual orientation, age and lifestyle in all of the activities, programs, and groups of the congregation.

We affirm that we are sincere in our intent to be all-inclusive in the sharing of the Good News of God's unconditional love and acceptance in Jesus. We especially emphasize our intention to be an open, accepting community for those who have been traditionally been alienated from, or rejected by the Church. We are ALL beggars and seekers. Our desire to be inclusive, therefore, is not to be understood as being motivated by self-righteousness, nor is it to be seen as patronizing in nature. All that we do at Mercy Church is motivated by a desire to share the Gift: life and hope as revealed in Jesus Christ.

We will offer a blend of tradition and innovation, sincere worship, and healthy skepticism. We seek to create a place where questions are encouraged, where you will not be handed a checklist of orthodoxy, asked to climb a moral improvement ladder, or told who to vote for. Mercy Church also believes that ambiguity is not the enemy of faith, but its partner. You may occasionally be led to suspend your reason. But you will not be required to sacrifice it.

We want Mercy Church to be a place for people to truly call home, and we take community and relationships very seriously. But, above all, we want Mercy Church to be a place for people who don't have it all together to come every week and re-hear and personally re-embrace the good news that Jesus has forgiven all of your sins: we have a welcoming God!

Why in the Spencer-Van Etten area? This is a different theological perspective than is represented in the local congregations, Bryan has already made these contacts over two years of meeting people in the area, and this will not look like any of the organized versions of religion currently found in the area.

Introduction to Starting a New Church

Starting a new church is not rocket science — it is much more complicated! A new church is the work of the Holy Spirit, which immediately puts this task way beyond our ability to understand. The following guide is linear, a series of 17 gatherings with assignments and steps a team could complete that take you from zero to a new church. Unfortunately, starting a new church is not linear; it is organic, contextual, and based on relationships between God and people. It is reformed and always reforming.

Our prayer is that you will let the Holy Spirit lead you. Our goal is to lay out a process that encourages you to address key aspects of starting a new church, while leading you to listen to the sometimes still voice of God, rather than ours or anyone else's. This process of discernment does not guarantee success, but we do believe it will help keep you focused on the one who starts new churches.

That said, we urge you not to fear failure, because God might be leading you to fail. Many of the Martyrs would be considered failures by our standard, yet their witness changed the world. Jesus gathered a mere 120 people who were considered his followers according to the first chapter of the book of Acts. That's hardly a great new church; in fact, most of us would have had Jesus attend a seminar led by Peter, who, in his first sermon, gathered 3,000 believers. Only God knows what God wants to accomplish through you and the new churches the Holy Spirit is placing on your heart. Trust God. Strive to be faithful rather than successful. Faithfulness brings a success beyond our imagination and wildest dreams.

Each of the 17 gatherings suggests a Bible study and an extended time of prayer. We encourage you to engage this process *slowly*. Resist the temptation to rush through the Bible studies and prayerful reflection. New church development is not the implementation of successful models and techniques; it is the faithful discernment of God's leading and the faithful implementation of God's mission. Wrestle with the scriptures, listen, and fall on your knees in humility.

Church planters and those who are attracted to beginning new churches are often "doers." We can't wait to get started, bring in the kingdom, make it happen and happen now. Remember Jesus told his "doers" to go back to Jerusalem, pray and wait until God's right time. We hope that all of you fellow "doers" will resist the temptation to start doing and will take the time to discuss, listen, discern, and wait for God's right time. We have countless stories of teams who were delayed in their plans and the finding of the right leadership took longer than expected, yet in hindsight those delays led the team to the "perfect timing."
