COME TO THE SPRING GATHERING **FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF ULYSSES** **SATURDAY, MAY 2, 2015!**



On Saturday, May 2, women from Geneva Presbytery and their ecumenical friends are invited to attend the Spring Gathering hosted by First Presbyterian Church of Ulysses, 69 East Main St, Trumansburg. **The day begins with registration from 9-9:30 a.m. and the program will conclude by 2 p.m. The suggested donation for the day's activities, including a deliciously prepared lunch, is \$5.00. Mark your calendars now and plan on bringing a friend!**

Rev. Cheryl Peebles of Trumansburg will lead worship. Our program theme will be "Community Gardens—Food Production." Our speaker, Mark DeCracker of Lyons, an avid photographer and founder/board member of Trail Works, Inc. The mission of Trail Works is to develop and/or designate nature trails without barriers that everyone can enjoy, regardless of mobility. With Mark's efforts and the support of the Lyons community, Trails Works, Inc. has built the Trail of Hope (www.trailofhope.org) which is an accessible trail with themed gardens adjacent to the Lyons Community Center. In partnership with Cornell Cooperative Extension's "Creating Healthy Places," school children have helped to plant beautiful flower and vegetable gardens along the trail.

During our "share" time after lunch, we will learn what other communities around the Presbytery are doing with their community gardens, as well as outreach food programs.

Your Presbytery Coordinating Team and our hostesses at Trumansburg First Ulysses hope you will join us for this day of fellowship, learning and inspiration.

URGENT NEED FOR SCHOOL KITS

Back-to-school shopping is a rite of passage, but for many the basic necessities of school life are out of reach. **CWS School Kits** are filled with pencils, erasers, scissors, crayons and more and give children in need what they need to succeed.

To assemble a School Kit you will need:

(All items must be new)

- One pair of blunt metal scissors (rounded tip)
- Three 70-count spiral notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (**no loose-leaf or filler paper**)
- One 12" ruler
- One hand-held pencil sharpener
- One large eraser
- Six new pencils with erasers
- One box of 24 crayons (only 24)



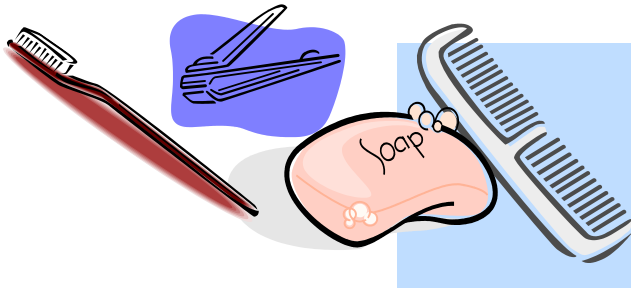
Bring your donations

In the face of natural disasters, violence, or grinding poverty, **Hygiene Kits** can mean the difference between sickness and health for struggling families.

To assemble a Hygiene Kit you will need:

(All items must be new)

- One hand towel measuring approximately 16" x 28" (no fingertip or bath towels)
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb
- One nail clipper
- One bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- One toothbrush (in original package)
- Six standard size Band-Aids®



Place all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure, remove excess air from bag, and seal. Please **do not add toothpaste** to the Hygiene Kit. (Cartons of toothpaste that have an extended expiration date will be added to Hygiene Kit shipments just prior to shipment.) **Please do not add additional items, such as cards or toys. These will be removed by CWS before distributing.**

A donation of \$2 for each kit for shipping is also requested and appreciated—that money is to be given or sent to Treasurer Lou Tarr so your group can receive credit for the donation.

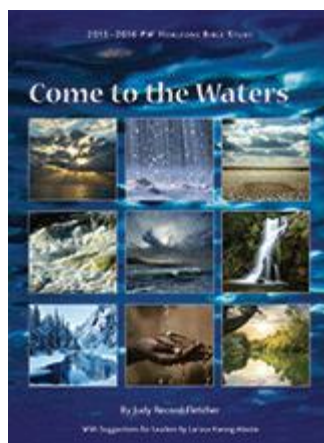

Come to the Waters - The 2015-2016 Horizons Bible Study

Come to the Waters by the Rev. Judy Record Fletcher is the Horizons Bible Study for 2015-16. The lessons of the study feature stories and images of water in the Bible. Just as water nourishes our bodies, so the passages on water nourish our spirits. The study opens with the chaotic waters of Creation and ends with the River of Life in the Revelation to John. Baptism, the absence of water, and streams of mercy are some of the other lesson themes. Women studying ***Come to the Waters*** will have their spiritual thirsts quenched as they grow in faith and understanding.

The full program begins with dinner on Tuesday and ends with lunch on Thursday. Registration and check-in will start on Tuesday at 4:00 PM.

The registration fee of \$260 covers meals and a shared double room in one of our lodges. If requested at registration, a limited number of private rooms may be available at an additional cost. WHAT IS THE BIRTHDAY OFFERING?

The Birthday Offering is collected in the spring of each year to celebrate the blessings in the lives of Presbyterian Women. The offering funds up to five projects not included in on-going General Assembly mission support. **This year the Ministries Offering Committee chose Community of St. Therese of Lisieux and Bethesda Christian Community Center to receive grants from the 2015 Birthday Offering.** Gifts to the 2015 Birthday Offering will allow these ministries to support women in Memphis, Tennessee, and Barranquilla, Colombia, who are overcoming oppressive, violent situations. The actual grant amounts for these worthwhile programs

will depend on gifts received in 2015. The goal for the offering is \$500,000. **It is suggested women offer one cent, ten cents, or even a dollar for each year of their age.**



The offering will be dedicated at the Spring Gathering, May 2 at Trumansburg First Ulysses. You may also send your contributions directly to Lou Tarr, 0505 Waterloo-Geneva Rd, Waterloo, NY 13165 after it has been collected in your group or congregation.

What is the Churchwide Gathering of Presbyterian Women?

The Gathering, held once every three years, is an opportunity for Presbyterian women from across the country (and around the world!) to gather for worship, education, community-building, fun and renewal. Participants will enjoy workshops, tours, and forums with inspiring speakers and worship. PW's triennial Business Meeting takes place the day before the Gathering (6/17-6/18) where budget, leadership and programmatic emphases will be decided. *Mary Cree from Park Presbyterian in Newark is our designated voting representative for Geneva Presbytery.*

Themed "One Body, One Spirit," the 2015 Gathering will explore 1 Corinthians 12:12–27:

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit."

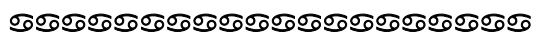
