May 23-26 – Memorial Day Family and Community Weekend – the first of 3 family weekends (see more dates below) open to all for a family gathering, get away, camp alumni gathering...we will offer a continental breakfast, chicken bbq and recreational options

June 15-20 – Pathfinder 1 for our adult friends with special needs. We will house participants in common age groups and have a variety of activities to meet the interests and abilities of each camper.

June 22-27 – Pathfinder 2 – Trailblazer Mini-Camp for ages 6-10. This is a great introduction to camp in a shorter session. We will house campers in separate units for ages 6-8 and ages 8-10.

July 3-6 – Independence Day Family and Community Weekend

July 6-11 – Trailblazer 1 for ages 8-17 with campers housed in age-appropriate units with their peers. The Trailblazer weeks are a classic summer camp program that fosters new friendships and connections while having a wide variety of activity offerings that campers can choose from.

July 13-18 – Trailblazer 2 for ages 8-17

July 20-25 – Pathfinder 3 for our adult friends with special needs.

July 27-Aug 1 – Pathfinder 4 for our adult friends with special needs.

July 20 – Aug 1 – Counselor in Training (CIT) The Counselor-In-Training program is a two-week leadership program for campers entering their Junior or Senior year of high school. The first week of the program is focused on leadership development, learning to serve and making the transition from camper to leader. The second week of the program, CIT's will be working directly with our Pathfinder campers, assisting the camp counselors.

August 17-22 – Adventure Camp for middle and high school students in a fun, wilderness-based trip camp. We will be traveling to and out camp location in the Adirondack Park just outside of Lowville, NY. We will be staying at a wilderness outpost in platform tents and Adirondack style lean-tos. Meals will be provided, and we will have guides to lead us on canoe trips, hiking trips and a rock wall/high ropes experience!



OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE



"God will cover you with their feathers, and under their wings you will find refuge; God's faithfulness will be your shield and rampart."

Psalm 91:4

The beginning of this year has brought unprecedented challenges for our neighbors in California, who are now facing a devastating disaster. The harrowing images of wildfires consuming parts of Los Angeles and Ventura counties have deeply impacted us all, stirring our hearts with sorrow and compassion. Authorities are reporting this as a historic and deadly wildfire event. More than 40,000 acres have burned, with over 12,300 structures destroyed, entire communities wiped out, and tens of thousands of residents displaced. Currently, 92,000 residents are under evacuation orders, and 89,000 more remain in evacuation warning zones, meaning they may need to leave their homes at a moment's notice. Tragically, at least 24 lives have been lost, and the numbers continue to rise as fires remain uncontained. This is an ongoing disaster, and the extent of damage and loss continues to evolve, with figures expected to change as the situation develops. As part of the ongoing response and in consultation with the Presbyteries of the Pacific, San Fernando and San Gabriel, as well as the Synod of Southern California and Hawaii and its leadership, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) has been in communication with faith leaders in the affected communities. In addition to In addition to providing emotional and spiritual care, PDA has already released emergency grants to meet the urgent needs of the communities and to provide immediate assistance. Though the final outcomes of these fires are yet to be known, we are clear that the magnitude of the event will require the development of longterm projects and assistance, both for the physical and emotional long-lasting effects. Presbyterians in the region are participating in coordination calls with nonprofit and faith-based disaster organizations to ensure that no one is forgotten.

PDA affirms our commitment to accompany those affected by this disaster. As people of God, once again we are called to stand with our siblings in the "GAP" — Give, Act and Pray.




Presbyterian Youth Triennium Event



This year the Presbyterian Church (USA) will welcome thousands of its high school age youth and their adult youth workers to Louisville, Kentucky for four days of worship, recreation, bible study, outreach, and faith formation all around the theme of, "As If We Were Dreaming". The event takes place from 28-31 July. More information will be available in the March and April newsletters. A committee of eleven from five presbyteries met on January 26 and shared the following details:

- The Geneva Presbytery will combine with Genessee Valley, Susquehanna Valley. Northern New York, and Cayuga-Syracuse to send one large delegation.
- Transportation will be by bus and all the anticipated costs for the weekend are estimated to be between \$700 and \$800.
- This year, there will also be a program for young adults 18-25, due to the (Covid) cancellation of the 2022 event.



You are invited to participate in this unique opportunity for education, fellowship, and an engaging exploration of what it means to be a follower of Jesus as part of a PCUSA church.
