# LeaderCare

## Committee on Leader Care

The Committee on Leader Care is here to assist leaders of our Presbytery in needs they may have. This care extends to Installed Pastors, Supply Pastors, CREs commissioned to churches or on the Pulpit Supply List, Moderators assigned by COM to churches, and other church leaders within our Presbytery.

**What is offered - first and foremost, is pastoral support for these leaders who have accepted these roles, and communication of needed prayers (If OK with those leaders). Many leaders are left off prayer lists, so we want to include all. Again, all communications with the Committee, or any member of the Committee, are Confidential unless the person contacting us says otherwise.**

Second, there is funding for pastoral care needs, or education needs beyond what is granted in an individual's covenant agreement with a church.

There is funding to assist with gift giving if a church leader should be recognized.

- Celebrations of life
- Presbytery staff and pastor retirement ceremonies

Also, there is funding for Education Assistance available. In all Installed Pastor Agreements and Supply Pastor Agreements there is a requirement for Continuing Education. However, sometimes needs exceed this level, or since there is no funding for CREs, Pulpit Supply, or others, even though they are asked each year what education they have pursued, this fund is a help to fill that gap.

The Committee also hosts an annual Retirees luncheon for retired pastors and CREs, as well as those considering retirement. We also prepare the annual Presbytery Necrology report.

## **First Presbyterian Church of Ithaca is Certified as a PC(USA) Earth Care Congregation**

Ithaca, NY – First Presbyterian Church of Ithaca was certified as an Earth Care Congregation by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s Presbyterian Hunger Program through February 2027. First Presbyterian Church of Ithaca has been an Earth Care Congregation since 2011. The Earth Care Congregation certification is designed to recognize churches that take seriously God's charge to "till and keep" the garden, that is our shared common home.

Since 2010, this PC(USA) program certifies and celebrates environmental ministry across 4 major areas of a congregation's life: worship, education, facilities, and outreach in the community. This program currently has 4.5% of all PC(USA) congregations and continues to grow each year.

Earth Care Congregations exist as important examples for congregations across the country. One of the goals of this program is to inspire churches to care for God's earth in a holistic way, through integrating earth care into all aspects of their church life. By the time a church has recertified for several years, the earth care ethic becomes ingrained in a congregation's culture, spreads to the surrounding community, and impacts the personal lives of individual church members. Obtaining this status speaks to the serious commitment that First Presbyterian Church of Ithaca has made to care for God's earth.

"First Presbyterian Church of Ithaca is just one of the 373 congregations in 42 states that chose to dedicate themselves to intentional care of God's earth this year. This denominational program for churches has lasted longer and been more successful than some other models we've seen and the individual churches that deserve all the credit for the success of the program. Our Earth Care Congregations are vital parts of their communities and inspirational witnesses to caring for God's creation and we are so grateful for their presence in the world," says Jessica Maudlin, Associate for Sustainable Living and Earth Care Concerns for the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

## JOIN THE PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN OF THE GENEVA PRESBYTERY FOR ITS SPRING GATHERING



*She arrived alone and afraid. The two-day bus trip gave her ample time to relive the trauma of the daily abuse. It also gave her time to imagine her future. She was ready for change, prepared to find hope and to heal. We watched her spend her last dollar at McDonald's, and then we drove her to the Potter's Hands Foundation safe home. Here, she learned she was loved. She learned that she had value. She learned that she had her own bed, she made friends who believed in her. She ate and reflected and grew - as a free woman with an independent mind and dreams.*

*Twelve months later, a newly confident young woman drove herself to her graduation party where she was greeted by dozens of friends and mentors. During her time with Potter's Hands, she earned her high school equivalency diploma, a driver's license, nursing assistant certification and full-time employment. Equally important, she embarked on a healing journey from trauma, addiction and abuse, and she found the conviction to lead other survivors of trafficking toward healing, wholeness and independence.*

PW of the Geneva Presbytery will hold its spring gathering in mid-May, at the Geneva Presbyterian Church in Geneva, NY. Featured guests will be the Potter's Hands Foundation, a faith-based, non-profit 501c3 organization committed to serving survivors of sexual exploitation and sex trafficking as they work through the process of restoration and healing. They dedicate themselves to providing a safe, secure environment in which female victims of severe childhood sexual abuse, human trafficking, and victims of human sex trafficking will receive physical, emotional, and spiritual healing, and learn the skills necessary for self-reliance and reintegration to society. We will also assist these individuals in building a support network of healthy relationships with family, friends, and community. Their overall goal is to support these women through the restoration process enabling them to become healthy and productive members of their communities. ## Leadership RSVP

Regarding Ruling Elders: A Monthly Series for Serving Faithfully

Most of us know the feeling. An invitation arrives in the mail; maybe it's for a wedding, ordination or a big church anniversary. This kind of gathering carries more than a date. It carries meaning. An important person or event is about to be honored, and occasionally that means something familiar is ending or something new is just beginning.

Along with the excitement comes quiet but familiar questions and feelings of anxiety. Do I go or stay? Who will be there? How formal will it be? What should I wear? Receiving an invitation is great news, and yet it still asks something of you.

Leadership can feel like that invitation. You don't have all the details. You're not sure what will be asked of you. But the invitation has arrived.


While it's great when you have a ready-made list of options for moving forward in ministry, how much would we enjoy having a spreadsheet that compares all the options and weighs the pros and cons? But here's the truth: God does not often send spreadsheets. God sends invitations.

And faithful leadership requires responding to God's invitation with the spiritual posture of RSVP.

RSVP comes from the French phrase "répondez s'il vous plait," meaning "please respond." An invitation creates a moment of agency where you get to choose your response. You may not have all the details, but your presence has been requested. This invitation asks for participation before certainty. So, what does it look like for ruling elders and sessions to RSVP to God's invitation? It requires four things:

### **R: Remember the story**

It is tempting to get stuck in nostalgia. Truthful remembering is not about going backward. It's about telling the truth about how we got here.

Every congregation carries both grace and grief in its history. Because ruling elders are stewards of memory, you can help the congregation remember its beautiful parts without turning them into idols. You can also help by naming the hard parts without turning them into shame. In the absence of truthful remembering, congregations tend to repeat patterns and remain stuck. 

## S: Staying present in uncertainty

The invitation to remain present is not a passive act. It is resisting the urge to rush toward solutions that calm anxiety but avoid real change. Faithful leadership asks us to remain present, with God's help. Steady presence is an act of leadership in the face of the unknown.

## V: Value new connections and voices

One of God's greatest invitations is the invitation to look again.

Looking again with new eyes invites us to see God's hand moving. Listening with new ears helps us hear wisdom spoken through unfamiliar voices. What if God is expanding our mission by expanding our understanding of who counts as neighbor, partner and community? It can mean listening to neighbors who understand the needs around you better than you do.

## P: Pray and prepare

Prayer comes last on purpose. It does not always give us God's full agenda, but it gives us the courage to keep showing up.

Prayer is alignment. It forms leaders who can act without needing certainty. And prayer pairs naturally with preparation: preparing hearts for change we cannot yet see and preparing minds for new relationships that will take us places we could not go on our own.

The most powerful leadership move is often not an answer but a courageous RSVP. You don't have to know the whole plan to say yes to God's invitation. You are not responsible for fixing everything. You are responsible to respond faithfully, which may mean RSVPing like Isaiah, who said, "Here am I. Send me!"

### For reflection:

- Where in this season is God inviting our congregation to respond?
- What parts of our heritage story do we need to remember more honestly, both the beautiful and the hard?
- When anxiety rises in our system, do we tend to rush, retreat or stay present? What would "steady presence" look like for us?
- Whose voices have we not valued yet, inside or outside the church, that might be part of God's renewing work among us?
- How might prayer form us into the kind of leaders who can prepare faithfully for what we cannot yet fully see?

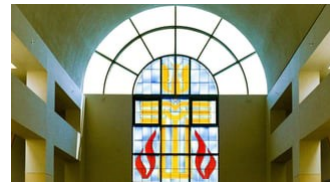

## PC(USA) launches book promotion to support ministry leaders with student debt

Registration opened Monday and is open to paid staff and eligible volunteers



LOUISEVILLE - The Office of Financial Aid for Service of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is launching a new initiative to support emerging leaders in ministry who are navigating student loan debt. In a program that began on Monday, the Student Loan Coaching Book Promotion will provide eligible participants with up to \$100 in book credits from the Presbyterian Publishing Corporation, along with free shipping.

- 10 years or less in ministry
- Must have student debt
- Register for Student Loan Coaching
- Complete People Joy Coaching Assessment



The promotion is available to individuals who have been in ministry for 10 years or less, including pastors, Christian educators, church music directors, and chaplains - serving in paid or volunteer roles. Applicants must have student loan debt, register for Student Loan Coaching through the Office of Financial Aid for Service (FAS), and complete the Coaching Assessment with FAS's partner, PeopleJoy, to receive the book credits.

"This book promotion is available to volunteers as well," said Sandra Duverge, associate for Financial Aid for Service. "We recognize that people in ministry are often volunteers, especially Christian educators." Duverge explained that eligible volunteers will still need to be carrying student debt and be employed by a nonprofit, even if it is not PC(USA)-related, in order to be eligible for Public Service Loan Forgiveness and the PSLF debt coaching provided by the Office of Financial Aid for Service and PeopleJoy.

Duverge emphasized that the promotion is designed to motivate new leaders to engage with coaching while providing essential resources for their spiritual and professional development. "Our hope is to build a strong foundation for the calling of people in ministry through access to printed resources as well as an encouraging coach to help people reduce student loan debt." she said.

The funds can be used to purchase a wide range of materials from the PC(USA) Store, including theology books, curriculum, children's books, Bibles, journals and other ministry-related resources. Distribution will be through physical shipments, with shipping costs covered by Financial Aid for Service.

The program is expected to run through the end of the year, with plans to continue in January. After 12 months, participants may be eligible for an additional \$50.

Duverge noted that while the up to \$100 credits are a strong incentive, the real value lies in helping ministry leaders begin their journey toward student loan forgiveness. "There's a lot of fear around financial instability and financial Debt," she said. "It's easier to ignore it even if eventually it's just going to become a bigger problem."

The timing of the promotion is especially important. Changes to federal student loan programs are set to take effect in July under the U.S. government's budget set forth

through the "One Big Beautiful Bill." Ministry leaders are encouraged to begin their student debt forgiveness journey now to ensure they are well-positioned before the new provisions are implemented.
